Criterion:

Principle of conferred powers

The member states remain masters of the treaty

Criterion:

Competence competency

The federal level holds sovereignty

Intergovernmental cooperation

➤ (Governments of) member states acting as a filter between the citizens and the organization



• Supranational integration

- ➤ Direct exercise of public power towards the citizen by institutions acting independently of the will of (governments of) the member states.
- ➤ Democratic feedback leads to a direct democratic power relationship between the individual citizen and the supranational entity.



• Imperial rule

- Rule of the centre over the periphery
- Without democratic feedback
